TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sometimes, this "Treasures" column can seem to be a species of crib-notes for Catholic Jeopardy. Indeed, you may never know when knowledge of our particular vocabulary may come in handy. Such is the case with papal bulls, which conjure up all sorts of images, but are actually not what you might expect. A bull is a papal letter on a matter of great consequence, such as a decision about a crisis in the Church, the declaration of a doctrine, the summoning of a council, or the canonization of a saint. It has a more solemn intention than a mere letter or even an encyclical, a teaching letter circulated through the whole Church. Its odd name comes from the Latin *bulla*, which is the stamp used to apply a signatorial design to the hot lead, or even molten silver or gold, that seals the decree.

The format for the bull is the name of the pope in Latin, followed by the title "servant of the servants of God," also in Latin, and then the text. The title of the bull is always the first two words of the text. Some famous papal bulls are *Exsurge Domine* (Arise, O Lord), written against Martin Luther's Ninety-five Theses in 1520; *Munificentissimus Deus* (The Most Bountiful God), the promulgation of the dogma of the Assumption in 1950 by Pope Pius XII; or *Humanae Salutis* (Human Salvation), by which Pope John XXIII convened the Second Vatican Council in 1962.


Pastor's Column

Back to School Theme: Community - In his book *Rediscover Catholicism*, Matthew Kelly speaks of the philosophies at work in our culture. They are: Individualism, Minimalism, Hedonism, and I would add Relativism. In the extreme, Individualism can simply be about taking care of oneself. Add Minimalism, the attitude of doing the least to get by, and Hedonism, the pursuit of pleasure or self-indulgence, and they become a recipe for a very self-centered and self-indulgent life. Add Relativism, when there is no Truth as to what's right and wrong, and life becomes about doing the least that's required in order to maximize my self-interest and self-indulgence. Imagine if these values were at work in a family relationship, with no Christ centered value to guide our conduct. Then everyone seeks only their self-interest and pleasure while doing the least for each other. These philosophies can become very destructive not only to the family but to society as well. But Jesus taught and modeled values that are very different than these. Jesus, instead of being self-centered, cared about others. Instead of doing the least, He gave His all, to the point of laying down His life for us. Instead of seeking personal pleasure, He sought what was good for others. And instead of teaching relativism, He taught The Way, the Truth, and the path that leads to Life. So this year, the School's theme for our students is Community. It's a challenge against our selfish nature and one that will help us to become our better and nobler selves. Please pray for our students, faculty, staff, and parish that all of us together may build a strong community from what Jesus taught and modeled for us.

Priests' Retirement - As the number of Americans reaching retirement age has increased, this is also true of priests reaching retirement age. Excluding Religious Order priests (e.g. Jesuits and Franciscans) of the approximately 184 diocesan priests in our Archdiocese, 83 are retired. Because of that, later this month on Sept. 17th and 18th, our parish will have a 2nd collection for them. And there will also be a special lunch to honor our retirees on Friday, Oct. 28, 2016 at 11:30am at St. Mary's Cathedral Hall. Many, like Bishop Walsh, continue to serve generously in our Archdiocese.


