

MISSIONARIES OF MERCY

Paul's back! After last week's "violent abuse," opponents organized a lynch mob that beat Paul nearly to death. But call Paul the "energizing evangelist," transforming deadly cruelty into life-giving zeal. Paul's past courage should inspire our commitment; Revelation's future "new heaven, new earth" should inspire our optimism. But Revelation's present assurance, "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race," should challenge us to become "missionaries of mercy." Because Pope Francis declared that the Church's credibility is completely dependent on our showing unconditional mercy. Mercy, said Francis, makes the Church, the world, and everyone young again, reawakened to life's noblest virtues. Fittingly, in today's Gospel Jesus reinforces that theme: "This is how all will know you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Frequent fliers today have many ways to accrue air miles, so one doesn't always have to endure long hours in cramped seats to earn free hours in cramped seats. In St. Paul's day, there were no such perks, nor would there have been any legal system for him to protest the shipwrecks he endured. He had other rewards in mind. The churches that he established in the catalogue of cities from today's first reading must have been very different from one another. Language, culture, customs, religious history, obstacles to community, social challenges, the places where they met, their clothing, their bread and wine, all distinct, particular to the area.

There were social customs as well: in a Christian household, the only place where a slave would be able to stand legally as an equal with the master would be at the table of the Lord, because at that table a new world of reconciliation was imaged. While Paul revered local customs, he was relentless about challenging the ways that people lived their Christian lives and how their worship reflected them. It is much the same today, as a global Catholic Church seeks to respect local customs and culture, allowing for differences in many things, yet always giving expression to the underlying presence of Christ, who binds us all together into his body.

Pastor's Column


My Guardian Angel — As a Pastor with limited resources and expertise, one thing I can count on to help me in my work is the Archdiocese. Many of you are familiar with the work of the Archdiocese, which provides chaplains to hospitals, prisons, and police and fire departments, as well as tuition assistance to low-income families, just to name a few of their city-wide projects.

But at the parish level, the Archdiocese assists me in numerous areas in the running of Saint Anne Church—from the maintenance of our buildings, to ongoing education for our teachers and catechists, to payroll, to legal questions about contracts or leases, to managing our employees' retirement and healthcare. The role of a pastor over the years has certainly become more complicated. Whereas in the past, the running of a parish was more like running a small family business, these days, with over 200 state laws that govern employer and employee relationships, the Archdiocese provides training for pastors to be good employers. And they assist us with their Human Resources Department, which helps us provide and manage healthcare and retirement benefits for our employees. In addition to that, the Department of Catholic Schools as well as the Religious Education Office provide ongoing education for our teachers and catechists. With the advent of modern technology, how can teachers use technology effectively in the classroom? Recently, we had our school seismically retrofitted. This is not an area of expertise for either our principal or me. But thankfully, the Archdiocese has a Property Support Department that helped us with placing bids and managing the work of the contractors. When the retrofit work was completed and the school moved back into the building, unfortunately the heat in half the building was not working. No one was taking responsibility to fix it but with the Archdiocese's help, they traced it to a pipe that a subcontractor had damaged and so could ensure that heat was restored to the other half of the building at no cost to us. The same with the Legal Department, which helped us with the lease of the convent to USF, and many other leases from hall rentals to entering into a contract with the Red Cross to use our facility in case of a disaster.

When I have questions relating to the parish, it's nice to know that as a Pastor, the Archdiocese will have my back and assist me. Our 2019 assessment for the **Archdiocesan Annual Appeal** is **\$50,288.60**. If you are able, I invite you to **join me in giving 1% to this appeal**, which is about \$500, or perhaps even half a percent, at about \$250. In return, we'll invite you to an appreciation Sunday Champagne Brunch early in the New Year.
