Pastor's Corner

Catholic Charities: In the front lines of the **Pandemic** - A mother had just given birth to her child. But because of covid-19, her husband was laid off from They weren't able to meet their rent, they needed groceries and on top of that, their sink was badly clogged so they could not use it. With the frequent advise to wash our hands during the pandemic, not having a sink to use can be very unsanitary. And because their landlord wasn't responding to them, a Catholic Charities case manager responded to their request for assistance. The case manager went out to them, on a weekend when Catholic Charities' offices are closed, and called a plumber to help them unclog their sink. In addition, the case manager also brought them groceries, diapers and the money needed to help them pay their rent. This is just one example of what Catholic Charities is doing 365 days a year. With more people being laid off and the City's response to moving the homeless into hotels, Catholic Charities is in the front lines of the Covid-19 pandemic. In partnership with the City of San Francisco, Catholic Charities has opened a 64 room hotel to house close to 200 individuals experiencing homelessness during the shelter-in-place order. But they do more than just provide for life's basic necessities. Their compassion is matched by their solution-oriented goal, to help vulnerable families toward a path out of homelessness. To date, they have helped close to 32,000 people and safely housed over 2,000 individuals. But this current climate has also affected the finances of Catholic Charities. Just as more people need their help, they've also suffered financial losses, losing income from CYO sports and transportation that in the past helped support their work with the vulnerable.
