



Pastor's Corner

Reopening our Churches for Mass - As our Governor is looking to issue new guidelines for Houses of Worship to reopen, Archbishop Cordileone assembled a Task Force to look into how we might be able to celebrate this safely in our own communities. This is only a preview of what might come and it may change based on the guidelines established by the Governor and the State's Health Department. Nonetheless, the Task Force recommended the following procedures for the worship space:

- Certain pews be cordoned off and tape should be put on the floor to help observe social distancing
- Members of a single household do not need to practice physical distancing with each other and may sit together in the same row.
- Masses inside church should be kept short 30-40 minutes. Masses can also be held in an alternative site like a parish hall or outdoors.
- Music is allowed by only one musician and one cantor but no choir and without congregational singing. (that's to limit aerosol spray in the air which is found to be the primary way infection takes place).
- Limit the number of people who can be inside the Church, which might mean either having an overflow room (or in our case, opening up the choir).
- Keep the doors of the churches open to minimize the need to touch common surfaces and to maximize the circulation of fresh air.
- Missalettes be removed from the Church and Holy Water fonts kept dry.

In addition, the following were recommended for conducting mass:

- All ministers must sanitize their hands before mass
- Priest should enter the sanctuary from the sacristy.
- Entrance, offertory and exit processions should be omitted.
- Collection or offertory baskets should be placed in strategic locations to minimize movement and contact with each other.
- Hosts for the faithful should be placed towards the side of the altar to minimize contamination as the priest prays the Eucharistic Prayer.
- The faithful exchange the sign of peace by bowing to each other.
- Communion for the ministers will take place in the usual manner (but without the cup). But for the community, it will take place after mass to allow for further safety precautions.
- After mass, those who wish to receive communion, can come forward. The priest and Eucharistic Ministers will don a mask and distribute communion to the faithful as they approach, keeping 6ft apart.

This is only a preview of what is to come. We will certainly keep you informed of any new developments. Praying for your safety and well-being, - Fr. Dan

Interpreters Needed - Catholic Charities is assisting with the State's distribution of Relief Assistance for Immigrants through a call center. They are looking for assistance in Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese, Thai, Samoan, etc. to assist them with phone calls with non-English speakers. This is to help them distribute 7,900 debit cards to immigrants for pandemic relief in the next six weeks. Their call center operates from 8am to 8pm, Monday-Saturday and volunteers can indicate the time they are available. When needed, the available volunteer will be called, then put into a conference with the client and staff. Novena to the Holy Spirit - 40 days after Jesus resurrected, He ascended into heaven. But prior to His departure, He told His disciples to pray that they may receive the Holy Spirit. 9 days later, on the feast of Pentecost, they received the promised Holy Spirit.
