Pastor's Corner

What to Expect When We Reopens for Mass - According to the guidelines established by the Health Department and the Archdiocese, we will be implementing the following procedures at St. Anne. Below is a Summary. See the following pages for a complete guide.

- As we can allow only 100 people inside, we will have only 2 entrances: the one on Funston & the corner of Judah & Funston. Each will let in 50 parishioners.
- As you arrive with your mask on, a volunteer will greet you and take your temperature.
- Then you can drop off the Consent & Contact Tracing Form (see page 4) or fill one out inside the Church.
- Some pews are sealed off to help you maintain the 6ft distance. Members of a household can sit together.
- As the virus is spread mainly through respiratory droplets, please keep your mask on throughout mass and know that we will have the doors open to help dilute any possible infected droplets.
- As singing and group recitation of prayers can spread respiratory droplets farther than 6ft, I ask you to sing and pray with all your heart but softly.
- Per Archdiocesan policy, Mass will be limited to 40 minutes to minimize exposure.
- For communion, the ministers will receive it at the regular time, but the Archbishop has instructed us to give communion to the faithful after the mass is over when we can take more precautionary steps such as donning a mask and sanitizing our hands.
- There will be only 2 communion ministers, the priest will stand in the front center aisle and the other will be in the middle center aisle. Please form only 1 communion line, while keeping social distance. And communion will be distributed only on the hand to minimize contamination.
- You are asked to come up the center aisle for communion and leave by the side aisle.

These rules may seem annoying and burdensome initially, but our goal is to minimize the risk so that we can all worship safely and comfortably. In time, these will be the “new normal,” until a vaccine is ready, when we can return to the “good old days.” Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we are navigating how to do this safely for everyone.

New Mass Schedule - Effective June 15, when we reopen our Church for public masses, we will be changing our Mass Schedule. The weekday 6:30am mass will be suspended for the duration of the Pandemic. And **our Sundays masses will be 5pm vigil, 8am, 10am & 12pm** (Chinese). This will give time to clean the pews and to change the air in the building. This lighter schedule will also help us as effective July 1, Fr. Peterson Tieng and I will also be responsible for Holy Name parish as their only priest, Fr. Zamora will be transferred to be the Pastor of San Bruno in San Mateo. Again, thank you for your patience and understanding.

A Guide for the Faithful in Reopening of our Church



Welcome

Thank you for waiting patiently for our Churches to reopen. Masses have certainly been incomplete without your presence. And though we are now tentatively scheduled to reopen on June 15, 2020, yet we know that there is still no cure for the Coronavirus. We still have to be cautious because transmission can still happen through infected respiratory droplets than can hang in the air and contaminated surfaces. Though the following guidelines issued by the proper authorities may seem burdensome initially, but after we get a hang of it, it'll become second nature to us. Let's aim to have 0 infections and do what we can to observe the following guidelines and help keep each other safe. And if you don't feel safe to return to Mass during the pandemic, the Archbishop reminds us that the dispensation from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy days is still in effect.

What you can do before coming to Mass

- If you are not feeling well, have a fever or coughing, please refrain from attending mass.
- Fill out the **Waiver and Contact Tracing** form so that when you arrive, you can simply drop it in our collection box.
- Consider donating to the parish using a check, instead of cash, or donate electronically (<http://www.stanne-sf.org/ministries/online-giving/>).

What to expect when you arrive at St. Anne

- As the State requires us to take your temperature before you enter, know that there will be a person checking your temperature as you arrive. It won't take long, but plan to arrive early and keep the appropriate distance.
- Only 2 doors will be used to enter the church, the one on Funston and the one on the corner of Judah & Funston. Each will let in 50 people. If one has reached its capacity, try entering through the other door. Unfortunately, we are only allowed 100 people in our Church.
- You are required to wear a mask and to use hand sanitizer before entering the Church. If you forget, we will have it available for your use.
- The center doors of the Church on Judah Street and the side doors of the Church on Funston and 14th Avenue will be left opened to allow fresh air in and to dilute possible infected respiratory droplets in the air.
- Certain pews will have a tape across it to help us observe the appropriate social distance. Household members can sit together in one pew.



Helpful practices during Mass

- As infection happens primarily through airborne aerosol, the State pointed out that singing and group recitation of prayers can spread respiratory droplets farther than 6 feet. We thus invite you to sing and respond with all your heart but to do it softly, under your breath.
- The Archdiocese has also limited masses to 40 minutes to minimize exposure, so we will keep singing to a minimum.
- As directed by the Archdiocese, communion for the faithful will happen after the end of mass when proper safety precautions can be observed. The priest and assisting ministers will receive communion at the normal time, but only after the dismissal, will the priest and assisting minister put on a mask and sanitize their hands before proceeding with the distribution of communion to the faithful.
- There will only be 2 communion stations, one by the entrance to the sanctuary, and one in the middle of the church. The floor is marked to help observe social distancing.
- The faithful are asked to receive communion only on the hand and not on the tongue in order to decrease the likelihood of contaminating the ministers' hands and infecting others.
- To minimize running into each other and break social distancing, during communion, the faithful are asked to come up in the center aisle and to leave by the side aisles.
- If you wish to spend a quiet moment to welcome and thank the Lord, please consider doing that in your car or you may take a moment in your pew while observing social distancing.



What to do After Mass

- If for some reason you do feel sick after attending mass and you suspect Covid-19, please check with your healthcare provider and notify us if you are tested positive. Let us know what date and time you attended mass so that we can inform others, the County Health Department and deep clean the Church. You can call the priest on duty at 415-866-6455.





Consent & Contact Tracing Form
during COVID-19 Public Health Crisis

St. Anne parish intends as best it can to follow all mandated Archdiocesan safety protocols and county regulations for public worship services. However, the county medical officer has advised us that public gatherings may nevertheless present an increased possibility of contagion even if safety precautions are taken, and therefore he has asked us to inform you that your participation may increase the risk for yourself and your family.

In particular, if you are over the age of 50 or have a chronic or underlying medical condition, a gathering increases your risk of contracting the virus or if you do contract the virus it may have a greater chance of creating serious illness that could even result in death. If you fall into this high-risk category and/or if you feel sick, are displaying COVID-19 symptoms (especially fever, cough or difficulty breathing) or if any of these symptoms are being experienced by someone in your household, you should stay home. The church cannot guarantee that there is no risk of infection for attendees.

Your signature below indicates that you understand these risks and agree to abide by all safety protocols and to follow all other instructions that may be given, and that you acknowledge the risks involved. This information will be kept confidential to the extent the law allows, will also be helpful with contract tracing should the need arise, and is protected from law enforcement and immigration authorities.
