## Pastor's Corner

**Fare Thee Well** - As we bid farewell to our students a couple of weeks ago, last Thursday, June 11, we also bid farewell to some outstanding teachers. Their combined years of service at St. Anne total 165 years. **Ms. Patricia Meek**, who had been teaching 7th grade, shared that she began teaching at St. Anne when she was 23-years-old. Her lifetime of experience teaching the various grades have made her a treasure at our school. The same is true of **Ms. Kathy Kelly** who has been teaching 8th grade, has been here for 41 years. **Ms. Chris Mangini**, who has been teaching 6th grade, has been here 39 years. And **Ms. Diane Hanni**, who has been teaching 3rd grade, has been here for 24 years. Last, but not least, **Ms. Kathy Phillips**, who has been teaching Science, has been here for 14 years. But Ms. Phillips is not retiring. She was offered and accepted a position at another school. So it's a great loss to our school to have 4 teachers retire and another start at a different school. Fortunately, they were also very good mentors. At our farewell celebration via Zoom, a computer meeting program, the teachers they've mentored over the years expressed not only the wisdom they've gained from working with them, but they also appreciated the friendships they've formed. I, myself, remember them when I was a Seminarian here in 1995-1996. I appreciated learning from them and how they included me in all their activities. In our farewell prayer, I shared with them a word I learned in Spanish. The word for blessed is both *Bendita* and *BienAventurada*. The first one we are familiar with as it is similar to our English word, Benediction. The second word is interesting because it uses 2 words to describe a blessing. *Bien* in Spanish means *good*. *Aventurada* means *Adventure*. So to be blessed also means to have a *Good Adventure*. As Mother Mary is blessed among women, she had a great adventure. And so as our teachers leave us and stay close to the Lord, not only will they have a bright future, but a Blessed Adventure as well. **Thank you Ms. Meek, Ms. Kelly, Ms. Mangini, Ms. Hanni and Ms. Phillip**, for giving us your very best that made our school great! Good St. Anne, pray for us and pray for them!!!

**Adapting to Reopening our Church and a New Mass Schedule** - Don't forget that effective **June 15**, our Church will reopen for public masses. The weekday 6:30am mass will be suspended for the duration of the Pandemic. And **our Sundays masses will be 5pm vigil, 8am, 10am & 12pm** (Chinese). Peterson Tieng and I will also be responsible for Holy Name parish as their only priest, Fr. Zamora will be transferred to be the Pastor of San Bruno in San Mateo. ## A Guide for the Faithful in Reopening of our Church



### Welcome

Thank you for waiting patiently for our Churches to reopen. Masses have certainly been incomplete without your presence. And though we are now tentatively scheduled to reopen on June 15, 2020, yet we know that there is still no cure for the Coronavirus. We still have to be cautious because transmission can still happen through infected respiratory droplets than can hang in the air and contaminated surfaces. Though the following guidelines issued by the proper authorities may seem burdensome initially, but after we get a hang of it, it'll become second nature to us. Let's aim to have 0 infections and do what we can to observe the following guidelines and help keep each other safe. And if you don't feel safe to return to Mass during the pandemic, the Archbishop reminds us that the dispensation from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy days is still in effect.

### What you can do before coming to Mass

- If you are not feeling well, have a fever or coughing, please refrain from attending mass.
- Fill out the **Waiver and Contact Tracing** form so that when you arrive, you can simply drop it in our collection box.
- Consider donating to the parish using a check, instead of cash, or donate electronically (<http://www.stanne-sf.org/ministries/online-giving/>).

### What to expect when you arrive at St. Anne

- As the State requires us to take your temperature before you enter, know that there will be a person checking your temperature as you arrive. It won't take long, but plan to arrive early and keep the appropriate distance.
- Only 2 doors will be used to enter the church, the one on Funston and the one on the corner of Judah & Funston. Each will let in 50 people. If one has reached its capacity, try entering through the other door. Unfortunately, we are only allowed 100 people in our Church.
- You are required to wear a mask and to use hand sanitizer before entering the Church. If you forget, we will have it available for your use.
- The center doors of the Church on Judah Street and the side doors of the Church on Funston and 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be left opened to allow fresh air in and to dilute possible infected respiratory droplets in the air.
- Certain pews will have a tape across it to help us observe the appropriate social distance. Household members can sit together in one pew.



### Helpful practices during Mass

- As infection happens primarily through airborne aerosol, the State pointed out that singing and group recitation of prayers can spread respiratory droplets farther than 6 feet. We thus invite you to sing and respond with all your heart but to do it softly, under your breath.
- The Archdiocese has also limited masses to 40 minutes to minimize exposure, so we will keep singing to a minimum.
- As directed by the Archdiocese, communion for the faithful will happen after the end of mass when proper safety precautions can be observed. The priest and assisting ministers will receive communion at the normal time, but only after the dismissal, will the priest and assisting minister put on a mask and sanitize their hands before proceeding with the distribution of communion to the faithful.
- There will only be 2 communion stations, one by the entrance to the sanctuary, and one in the middle of the church. The floor is marked to help observe social distancing.
- The faithful are asked to receive communion only on the hand and not on the tongue in order to decrease the likelihood of contaminating the ministers' hands and infecting others.
- To minimize running into each other and break social distancing, during communion, the faithful are asked to come up in the center aisle and to leave by the side aisles.
- If you wish to spend a quiet moment to welcome and thank the Lord, please consider doing that in your car or you may take a moment in your pew while observing social distancing.



### What to do After Mass

- If for some reason you do feel sick after attending mass and you suspect Covid-19, please check with your healthcare provider and notify us if you are tested positive. Let us know what date and time you attended mass so that we can inform others, the County Health Department and deep clean the Church. You can call the priest on duty at 415-866-6455.





**Consent & Contact Tracing Form**  
during COVID-19 Public Health Crisis

St. Anne parish intends as best it can to follow all mandated Archdiocesan safety protocols and county regulations for public worship services. However, the county medical officer has advised us that public gatherings may nevertheless present an increased possibility of contagion even if safety precautions are taken, and therefore he has asked us to inform you that your participation may increase the risk for yourself and your family.

**In particular, if you are over the age of 50 or have a chronic or underlying medical condition, a gathering increases your risk of contracting the virus or if you do contract the virus it may have a greater chance of creating serious illness that could even result in death. If you fall into this high-risk category and/or if you feel sick, are displaying COVID-19 symptoms (especially fever, cough or difficulty breathing) or if any of these symptoms are being experienced by someone in your household, you should stay home. The church cannot guarantee that there is no risk of infection for attendees.**

Your signature below indicates that you understand these risks and agree to abide by all safety protocols and to follow all other instructions that may be given, and that you acknowledge the risks involved. This information will be kept confidential to the extent the law allows, will also be helpful with contact tracing should the need arise, and is protected from law enforcement and immigration authorities.
