Pastor's Corner

Welcome Fr. Celestine Tyowua - I'd like to introduce Fr. Celestine to you. As the Archbishop has assigned me to be the Administrator of Holy Name Church, effective July 1, 2020, he has also sent another priest to assist me: Fr. Celestine. Although he will be in residence at Holy Name, but his assignment, like me, will be to both parishes, St. Anne and Holy Name, effective also July 1. Below is a little autobiography of Fr. Celestine:



"I love to be of service to God and His People. I grew up in a very devout Catholic family that shaped my faith right from childhood which led me to discover my calling to the priesthood at the age of five. I went through Catechism classes for all the sacraments I received before going to the Junior Seminary and then the Major seminary in Nigeria. I was ordained on 1st August 2009 worked in several parishes in Nigeria as Parochial vicar and as Pastor, and then St Brendan here in San Francisco. I am happy to be a part of this wonderful Parish as the Assistant to Fr. Daniel Nascimento. I am available for the wonderful parishioners of Holy Name and St. Anne anytime you need me to be there for you, together we shall grow in the spirit of God as we journey towards heaven."

Why SF Health Department is slow in reopening Churches? - Although many of us would like to return to some normalcy, Dr. Tomas Aragon, a Health Officer for SF, made a compelling presentation to the Interfaith Community on June 18, 2020. We're all seeing what happens when communities open up too quickly: the rate of infection increases. Dr. Aragon explains that they watch 2 numbers to guide their decision in when to reopen: (1) the rate of reproduction number and (2) the number of infections within the community. If the reproduction number is high (e.g. - 1 sick person on average infects 5 people) the infection within a community can grow quickly. They're trying to keep the reproduction number on average to 1 or below. Obviously, a negative number is better. Also, if fewer people are infected in a community, then we can do "riskier" activities like eating in restaurants. They divided the phase II reopening into 3 parts, A,B and C, giving time to see how each reopening is affecting the number of infections within a community. As some of you might be seeing in the news, the rate of infection is growing so businesses that were scheduled to be reopened on June 29, phase II C, are now on hold. Because of that, the Parish Council and I thought we would be more cautious and not hold indoor masses for now, although the Archbishop does allow up to 12 people indoors. **Dr. Aragon lifted the limit of people attending an outdoor mass so you're welcome to join us for the weekend liturgies outdoors (dress warmly):**

Informed Consent for In-Person Attendance at Mass During COVID-19 Public Health Crisis

St. Anne parish intends as best it can to follow all mandated Archdiocesan safety protocols and county regulations for public worship services. However, the county medical officer has advised us that public gatherings may nevertheless present an increased possibility of contagion even if safety precautions are taken, and therefore he has asked us to inform you that your participation may increase the risk for yourself and your family.

In particular, if you are over the age of 50 or have a chronic or underlying medical condition, a gathering increases your risk of contracting the virus or if you do contract the virus it may have a greater chance of creating serious illness that could even result in death. If you fall into this high-risk category and/or if you feel sick, are displaying COVID-19 symptoms (especially fever, cough or difficulty breathing) or if any of these symptoms are being experienced by someone in your household, you should stay home. The church cannot guarantee that there is no risk of infection for attendees.

Your signature below indicates that you understand these risks and agree to abide by all safety protocols and to follow all other instructions that may be given, and that you acknowledge the risks involved. This information will be kept confidential to the extent the law allows, and is protected from law enforcement and immigration authorities. *Should you desire to share the mass time and date, it will help with contact tracing should the need arise.*
