Pastor's Column

On Voting – In regard to the electoral process, Pope Francis says: “*We need to participate for the common good. Sometimes we hear: a good Catholic is not interested in politics. This is not true: good Catholics immerse themselves in politics by offering the best of themselves so that the leader can govern.*” So the Catholic is called to be a faithful citizen. We are called to make informed voting decisions based on a clear understanding of our faith and a deep appreciation of life, the common good, solidarity, care for the poor, and the other principles of faith and morals that are to guide our life. To assist us in this, the California Conference of Catholic Bishops has published materials to help us develop an informed conscience and navigate the complex and confusing choices. While the California Bishops take no position on most of the propositions, below are two propositions on which they recommend a NO vote:

Proposition 14 – This proposition proposes the issuance of a \$5.5 billion bond for the California Institute for Regenerative Medicine, a state program created to fund stem cell research, including research involving embryonic stem cells. Because Catholic teaching objects to using human embryonic stem cells for experiments and because there is inadequate financial accountability and oversight of taxpayer funds, the California Catholic Conference of Bishops opposes this proposition and recommends a **NO** vote.


Proposition 20 – this proposition proposes to make changes to policies related to criminal sentencing charges, prison release and DNA collection, repealing Prop 47 (2014) and Prop 57 (2016), both supported by the California Bishops. Both Prop 47 & 57 were a shift in policy, reallocating resources toward rehabilitation in the state’s criminal justice system. A Yes vote for Prop 20 would repeal the progress made to rehabilitate a person and emphasize instead a more punitive approach to the California justice system. Because of that, the California Catholic Conference of Bishops opposes this proposition and recommends a **NO** vote.

While good people can disagree on any number of issues, the California Bishops encourage us to be civil, to have honest debates instead of personal attacks that divide communities. They encourage us to promote civility, to love our neighbor and to build our community. 
