



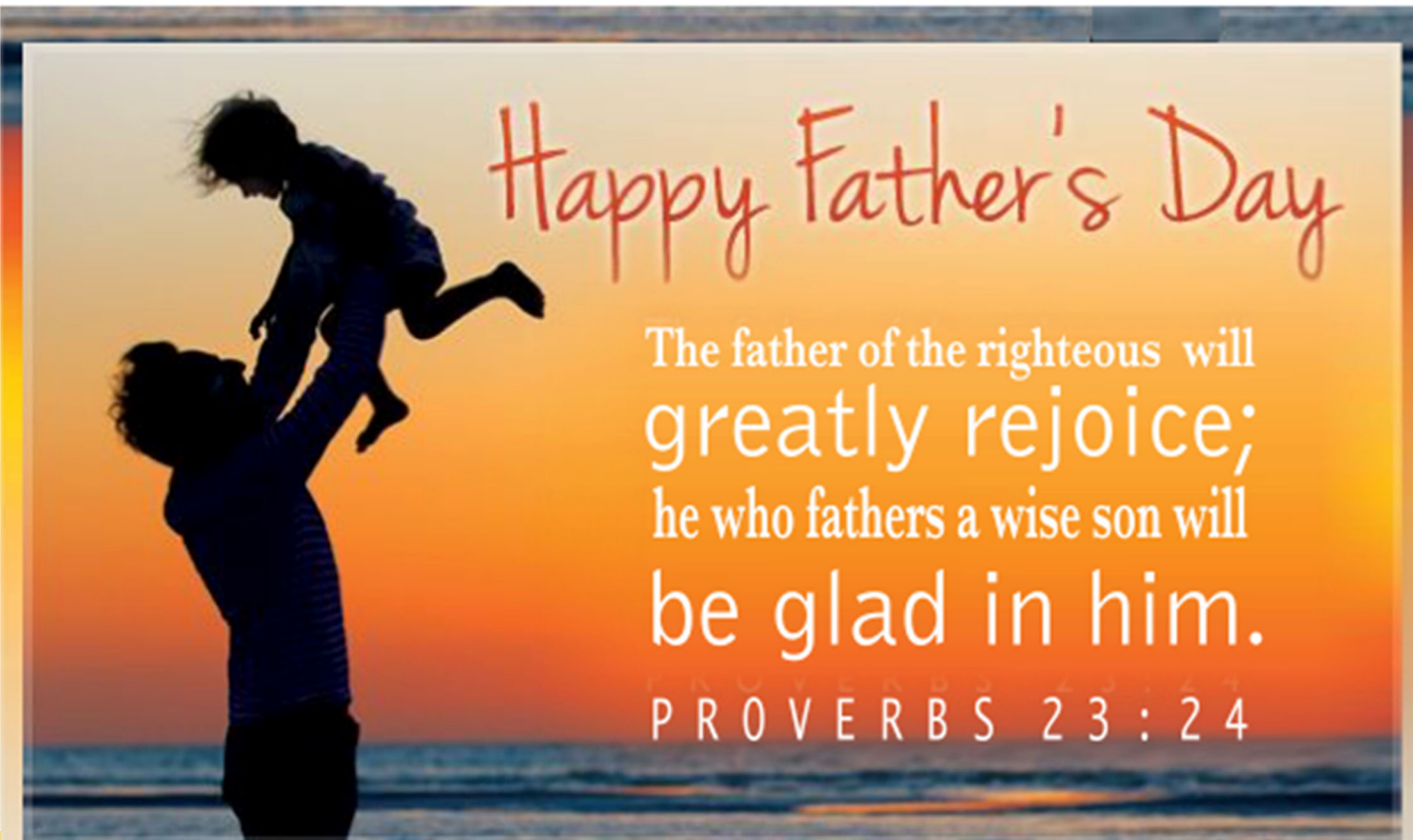

THE WIND AND THE SEA

Living along the shores of Lake Superior—the “big lake,” as the locals call it—you can often hear the advice, “Respect the lake; don’t take it for granted.” People who know Lake Superior respect its power and watch out for its many moods. The readings of this Sunday evoke our memories of the lake, of the mighty Mississippi River, or of the ocean itself. Who but God can control these mighty waters and set limits to their advance? But these mighty agents are subject to God. The sailor and the fisher all respect the water. Even more, they respect the awesome power of the Maker of wind and sea.

FEAST OF FAITH — *The Collection: A Privilege*

As the altar is prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist, the collection is taken up. In the early church, this part of the Mass must have been something to behold, as the people suddenly began to move, bringing forward to the deacons and priests freshly-baked bread and fine wine. Then, after the Eucharistic Prayer, that same community came forward again in the Communion procession, and they received back the very gifts they had given, now transformed into something infinitely more precious than bread and wine: the very Body and Blood of Christ.

Beginning around the eleventh century, it became the custom for people to present money instead of bread and wine, and the procession of the faithful gradually disappeared (it survives in the liturgy of Holy Thursday). But the meaning is the same. We continue to bring the fruit of our labors and to offer them freely to God. And God continues to transform them into Christ. It is through our generous sharing of time, talent, and treasure that our parishes can preach the gospel, reach out to the sick and the imprisoned, and celebrate the sacraments.

Pastor’s Column

Revised Covid Protocols – On Tuesday, June 15, based on increased vaccinations and the success in containing the Coronavirus, the State and City’s Health Department lifted many of the health and safety restrictions. But as our public health officials remind us, the pandemic is not yet completely over. So the Archbishop instructed us to be vigilant and responsible in ensuring maximum health and safety of our parish communities. Out of an abundance of caution, the Archbishop issued the following revised safety protocols for mass. They are as follows:

- What will remain the same:
 - ◇ Doors and windows will remain open for ventilation.
 - ◇ Congregants are to wear masks for indoor mass (unless they have a physical or personal difficulty with it).
 - ◇ The *Sign of Peace* is to be exchanged with a reverent bow to those near them.
 - ◇ Holy Communion is to be distributed under the species of bread only.
- What will be discontinued:
 - ◇ From June 24, 2021, the **dispensation from attending Sunday mass will be discontinued**. Of course, if one is sick, one is dispensed from attending mass.
 - ◇ Contact tracing, consent forms, and taking of temperatures will not be required.
 - ◇ Sanitizing pews and other high-touched areas before services will not be necessary.
 - ◇ Wearing of masks for outdoor services will not be required.
- What will be restored:
 - ◇ **Obligation to attend Sunday mass will be restored beginning June 24, 2021.**
 - ◇ Collections can be taken up by ushers using baskets with handles.
- What will be modified:
 - ◇ Social distancing reduced to 3 feet between households.
 - ◇ Small choirs are allowed to return, with members wearing masks and keeping at least 12ft. apart from each other.
 - ◇ Congregation may sing if masks are on.
 - ◇ Liturgical ministers will not have to wear masks while carrying out their liturgical duty (including cantors at the ambo, if the closest person is 12ft. away)

The Archbishop also wanted to convey that no one will be asked of their vaccination status before being allowed to attend mass. While there are still restrictions in place, this latest revision is yet another step that we’re taking to the day when all restrictions will be lifted. I thank you in advance for observing these latest protocols and I look forward, with you, to the day when all these restrictions will be lifted.
