Pastor's Column

Happy Father's Day – On the feast of St. Joseph in March 19 of 2014, Pope Francis spoke of this great patron saint to fathers. He pointed out that although God is the true father of Jesus, Joseph was a father to Him and helped him grow in 3 dimensions: *wisdom, age, and grace*. He said that growing in **age** is the most natural dimension. Joseph cared for Jesus' **physical and psychological growth, ensuring that He lacked nothing for a healthy development** -- which also meant that when His life was in danger, Joseph took Jesus and His mother safely to Egypt as refugees. And once Herod died and they were able to safely return, he instructed Jesus in his work, and Jesus learned to be a carpenter. In the 2nd dimension, growing in **wisdom**, Joseph was for Jesus the example and teacher of the **wisdom that is nourished by the Word of God**. Joseph helped



form the little Jesus to listen to Sacred Scripture and going to the Synagogue in worship. Joseph helped the little human Jesus grow in Wisdom that comes from Above. And lastly, Joseph also helped Jesus to grow in **grace**, which means to recognize the abundant blessings and help of God in our lives. St Luke points out that "*the favor of God was upon Him*" (Lk 2:40). While


God's favor and grace is always at work in our lives, it takes faith to help us see and appreciate that. **Joseph, a man of faith, certainly helped Jesus recognize God's grace and favor at work in His life.** So Pope Francis points out that what Joseph did for Jesus is an example for us to imitate. He encourages all fathers "*to be ever close to your children, allow them to grow, but be close, close! They need you, your presence, your closeness, your love. May you be for them as St Joseph was: guardians of their growth in age, wisdom and grace. May you guard them on their journey: be educators and walk with them. And by this closeness you will be true educators.*" Pope Francis concluded by entrusting to St Joseph, "*All parents, priests — who are fathers — and those who have an educational role in the Church and in society.*" And I join Pope Francis in expressing our gratitude and blessings: "*Thank you for all you do for your children: Thank you! May St. Joseph bless you and accompany you... Best wishes to you, and a Happy Fathers' Day to All Fathers.*"



THE GIFT OF THE EUCHARIST

Today we hear how Abram encounters Melchizedek, "king of Salem . . . and a priest of God Most



High" (Genesis 14:18). Melchizedek appears nowhere else in scripture, but is nonetheless significant. Psalm 110 declares of the great King David, "You are a priest forever,

in the line of Melchizedek," a description later given (in the letter to the Hebrews) to Christ as High Priest.

Early Christians saw in Melchizedek's bread and wine the bread and wine of the Eucharist; Paul's account of the Last Supper (in today's second reading) is the oldest one in scripture. In the Gospel, Luke describes Jesus providing bread for a crowd in words similar to Paul's, words still used by the Church: Jesus takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it. Together, these three readings reveal how Christian priesthood, Christ's Real Presence, and the call to serve those in need are all found in the gift of the Eucharist.

TREASURES from OUR TRADITION

We owe today's beautiful feast to a valiant woman who suffered a great deal to establish a feast out of her love for the Eucharist. Juliana was a nun in Belgium in the thirteenth century. She served in a hospital for lepers. She became convinced through her prayer that the liturgical year was incomplete because it had no feast for the Eucharist. Her efforts were not welcome, and a supervising priest sought to punish her for promoting a feast that "nobody wanted." He even had her accused of financial mismanagement and banished her from her convent. Shortly after she was exiled, the bishop approved the feast. It quickly spread through Europe. In those days, people very seldom received Holy Communion, and so the processions through the streets with the eucharistic bread not only led to an awareness of Christ's hunger to be with us, but prepared the way for a deeper desire to receive Christ's Body and Blood in more frequent Communion. The feast grew rapidly, but Juliana disappeared into poverty and a hidden life. She ended her days as an "anchoress," a woman living in seclusion in a room attached to a parish church. Imagine her delight at seeing us gathered at the table of the Lord on this day, aware of Christ's presence in our midst, sharing fully in Christ's Body and Blood.
