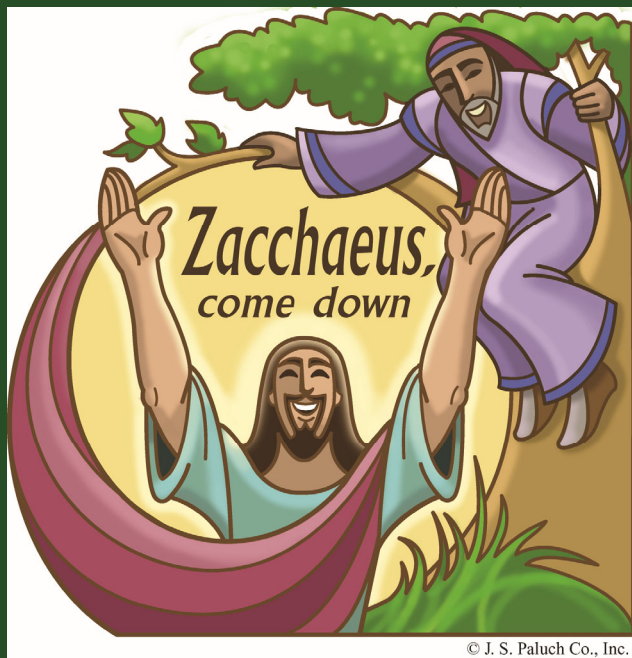

Pastor's Column

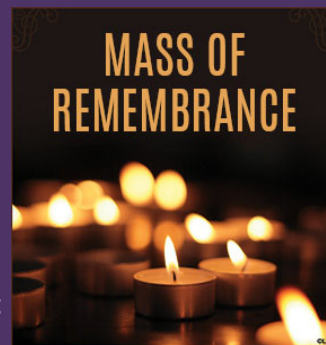

A Compassionate God

Today's reading from the book of Wisdom presents an image of a patient God who "rebuke[s] offenders little by little" (*Wisdom 12:2*), an image endorsed by the psalmist, singing of how the LORD is "slow to anger and of great kindness, and compassionate toward all his works" (*Psalms 145:8, 9*). The crowd with Jesus, however, grumbles when they see Jesus's kindness and compassion extended to Zacchaeus, who was not just a tax collector, but the "chief tax collector"—a title that surely emphasizes his standing as a sinner to be scorned. In the second reading, Saint Paul urges the Thessalonians to be "worthy" of God's calling, so that "the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you" (*2 Thessalonians 1:12*); such people, unlike the crowd in the Gospel, would rejoice at Zacchaeus's determination to change his life after encountering Jesus.

Tuesday, November 1st is All Saints Day, a Holy Day of Obligation. Let's take this opportunity to make time for prayer, thanking and praising the Lord at Mass in the midst of a busy week. There are three Masses at our parish that day: **8:45am, Noon, and 6pm.** Let us honor all members of the Body of Christ now rejoicing in Heaven as models of heroic sanctity on earth. ***They have competed well, they have finished the race, they have kept the faith!*** (cf. 2 Timothy 4:7)

Know the truth about Prop 1 on November's ballot — It's extreme, expensive, and unnecessary.
