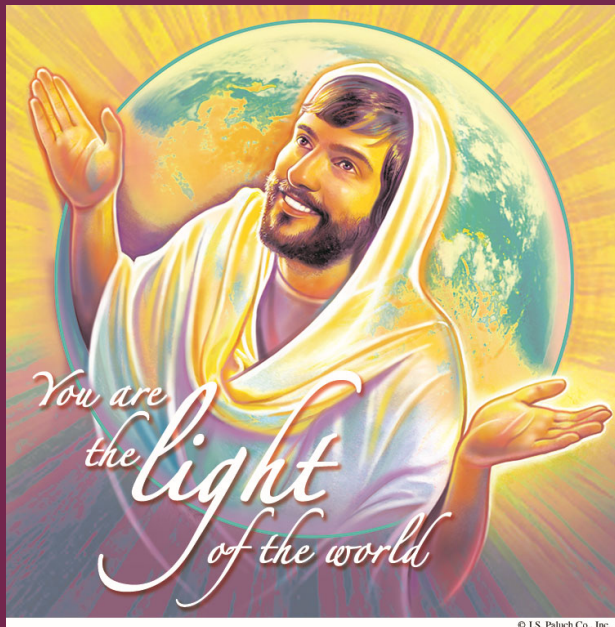

The prophet Isaiah inspires us with these words: "Light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday." Surely each of us knows the gloomy side of life, but today's readings propose a brilliant antidote to misery: the light of service. Isaiah focuses on physical suffering, telling us to provide food, clothing, housing, and equal opportunity to those with limited resources. Moving beyond material needs, Saint Paul demonstrates how to proceed humbly when attending to people's spiritual needs. Saint Matthew's Gospel stirs us to bold action: whatever gifts we have, we must put them at the service of our communities. As Christians, we must engage with one another without holding back, letting our light shine before all.

Pastor's Column



Knights of Columbus – You might have seen during Sunday hospitality after mass, men dressed in bright blue jackets with a logo Knights of Columbus serving coffee and pastry treats. Or you might also have seen them lead a procession at our annual St Anne's Novena. So who are these Knights and what do they do? The Knights were founded in 1882 by Fr. Michael McGivney in New Haven, Connecticut. It is a Catholic fraternal organization that promotes education and charitable and religious works. Being a worldwide organization, they help not only at the local parish and diocese in collaboration with the Pastor and Bishop, but throughout the world, wherever there is a need. For example:

- Between 2014 and 2018, they provided aid to Christians and other religious minorities in the Middle East.
- In 2018 they helped refugees at the US-Mexico border seeking asylum.
- And in 2022 when Ukraine was invaded, the 2,000 Knights in the country worked to help those impacted. They began providing food and clothing to those at train and bus stations in Lviv who were fleeing to Poland. They organized buses to take people to the Polish border and the Knights in Poland helped more than 300,000 people, or 10% of those who fled that country.
- They also offer assistance to local organizations that work helping those with intellectual and physical disabilities, such as the Pomeroy Center in San Francisco, as well as the Special Olympics.

In late 19th century, before government support programs were established, the Knights set up their own insurance program to help widows when the main income earner died. From this simple beginning, the Knights have grown into a worldwide insurance company that offers permanent and term life insurance, as well as annuities, long term care insurance, and disability insurance. It has received A.M. Best's highest rating of A++. This enables the Knights to support and donate not only to worthwhile causes such as the Special Olympics, but also to the institutional Church. They are a major donor to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, to the Vatican's news operation, and to the Pope's charitable causes. In 2018, they reported not only donating 76 million volunteer-hours but also \$185 million towards charity. A few notable Knights in the US are: John F. Kennedy, Ted Kennedy, Samuel Alito, Vince Lombardy and Babe Ruth.

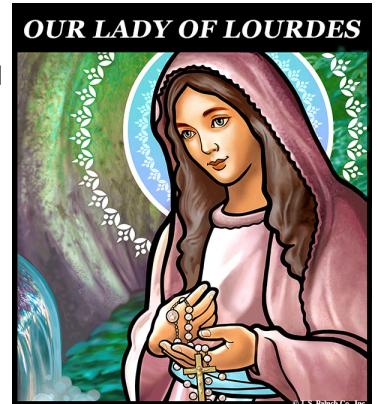

Our Lady of Lourdes (February 11)

On February 11, 1858, fourteen-year-old Bernadette Soubirous, the oldest of nine children in a poor family from Lourdes, France, saw Our Lady in the first of 18 apparitions. At the grotto of Massabielle, Bernadette saw "a small lady in white" who invited her to return each day. During the visions the Lady communicated a message of penance, instructed Bernadette to dig so that a spring of water began to flow, requested that a chapel be built there at the grotto, and eventually identified herself by saying "I am the Immaculate Conception." Throughout these apparitions, Our Lady addressed Bernadette in a formal way, treating the humble girl with dignity. In 1862 the authenticity of the apparitions was confirmed by Church authorities. The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes was recognized worldwide in 1907. Lourdes became a place of pilgrimage for thousands of the faithful; their faith and the faith of many others was revitalized through the story of a simple young girl from rural France.

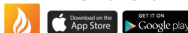
