Pastor's Column

Our High Holy Days – As Catholics, our highest Holy Days are the period between Palm Sunday and Easter. Also known as Holy Week, we recall the journey Jesus took to save all of human kind. This week begins with:

- **Palm Sunday** – Upon Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. He was greeted by the crowds who shouted "Hosanna," which means "Save us." They were looking for a Savior who would deliver them from the Roman oppressors, but when Jesus didn't lead a rebellion against the Romans, they turned on Him.
- **Holy Thursday** – This night, we remember Jesus' institution of the Eucharist. He promised that He would be with us always and left us this meal as a Memorial. He also comes as a Suffering Servant who washes His disciples' feet. And so the presider at the Mass will wash the feet of a few volunteers. At the conclusion of the liturgy, just as Jesus took His disciples into the Garden of Gethsemane to pray, we will

also spend time keeping company with Jesus for what is to come.

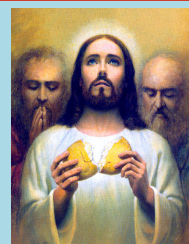
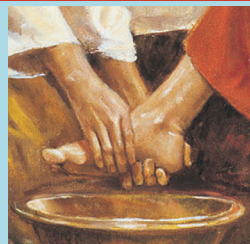
- **Good Friday** – As Jesus was crucified from Noon to 3pm, we will also spend that time with Him. Beginning at 12pm, we will meditate on the Seven Last Words of Jesus. At 1:30pm, we will Venerate the Cross. At the conclusion of the Liturgy, at 3pm, we will make the Sacrament of Reconciliation available. We will have Veneration of the Cross in Chinese at 5:30pm and a 7:00pm Stations of the Cross in English
- **Holy Saturday** – After the death of Jesus, Scripture tells us that darkness entered the land. And so the Easter Vigil liturgy will begin in darkness. We wait in vigil for the Light of Resurrection to appear. During the Vigil, we recall the story of our Salvation from the Old Testament to the New Testament. On that night, we will also Baptize and Confirm eight adults who have been preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation. This truly is a joyful time as Christ is victorious over the forces of darkness and death.
- **Easter** – And of course, the Church continues this celebration of New Life on Easter Sunday. We will have a Pancake breakfast after the 8am & 10am masses and an Easter Egg hunt for the little ones after the 10am mass. We hope you'll be able to join us in one or all of these upcoming Liturgies of our Salvation. Tell a friend and come join us.

Encounter with the Cross

The journey of Lent brings us to an encounter with the cross. During Lent, we have been led more deeply into questions at the heart of our faith: Who is God? And who are we, the Church? The Gospel of Matthew indicates that, in the crucifixion, God's true nature is most fully revealed in Jesus. In Jesus, God is the self-emptying One, who embraces humility and suffers rejection, as Paul tells the Philippians. God's power is redefined, present not in coercion and violence, but in Jesus' unbounded love. We the Church can learn who we are, the followers of the Crucified One, when we bear crosses that offer life and hope to the world. We more fully become the Church when we empty ourselves by sharing in others' sufferings, rejecting violence, and taking risks for justice and reconciliation.
