ADVOCATE FOR CALIFORNIA LEGISLATION

Upholding Catholic Values

A full explanation of each bill is given as well as contact information for the legislator who is sponsoring it.

Examples of Bills to support :

SB 4 would streamline the process for religious organizations to develop affordable housing on their property.

SB 646 allows parents and minor victims of sex trafficking and abuse to sue when images of their exploitation are posted online.

Examples of Bills to oppose:

AB 1432 would require all insurance companies doing business in California to cover abortions, abortion-related services, and gender transitions. **AB 315** would allow lawsuits against a pregnancy center for speech that is "false or misleading advertising" about abortion.

Pastor's Column

Appreciating Fathers – On this day that our nation honors our fathers, I came across this article in *Psychology Today* by Clinical Psychologist, Dr. Ditta Olikier entitled, "The Importance of Fathers." In it, she wrote that in Biblical times, a father's authority was unquestioned and final in all matters relating to the family. In the 20th century, however, his influence was increasingly seen as minor or negligible. Perhaps the only importance was how well he provided for the family. In the latter part of the 20th century, things began to change and the importance of fathers is now widely recognized. According to a report in "Fathers and Their Impact on Children's Well-Being," it stated: *Even from birth, children who have an involved father are more likely to be emotionally secure, be confident to explore their surroundings, and, as they grow older, have better social connections.* Dr. Olikier continued: *The way that fathers play with their children also has an important impact on a child's emotional and social development. Fathers spend a higher percentage of their one-to-one interactions with infants and preschoolers in stimulating, playful activity than do mothers. From these interactions, children learn how to regulate their feelings and behavior. Children with involved, caring fathers also have better educational outcomes. The influence of a father's involvement extends into adolescence and young adulthood. Numerous studies find that an active and nurturing style of fathering is associated with better verbal skills, intellectual functioning, and academic achievement among adolescents.* On this day that we honor our fathers, perhaps we can take a moment to express our gratitude to them. Obviously, our fathers are not perfect, just as their children are not. In some cases, our fathers may even be absent from our lives. But perhaps we can still thank those who tried to fill that role as best as they could. And to those whose fathers have passed, perhaps we can say a prayer for them, thank them, forgive them if needed, or ask forgiveness in return. May God our Heavenly Father, bless our human fathers, and help them to love their children, as best as they can. And may we love our fathers and show them gratitude and appreciation in return.
