**“Daughter, your faith has saved you.”**

### *Healing through Faith*

The 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B teaches us to trust in Jesus’ power and love. In the Gospel of Mark, we see two powerful miracles..... The woman with the hemorrhages is cured immediately when she touches Jesus’ garment..... Her bold action shows her deep trust in Jesus’ power. On the other hand, Jairus’ daughter has already died by the time Jesus arrives. Her healing takes longer, but Jesus restores her to life....

Both healings involve physical touch. The woman initiates her healing by reaching out to Jesus. She believes that even touching his garment will heal her. Her faith and action lead to her cure. In the case of Jairus’ daughter, Jesus reaches out to touch her. He takes her hand and tells her to get up. This act of touch brings her back to life. It shows Jesus’ compassion and his willingness to connect with those in need.

These stories show us that everyone’s encounter with Jesus can be different. Some may reach out to Jesus in faith, while others are touched by Jesus in their need. But in all cases, faith is key. When we face challenges, we must believe that Jesus is with us.

***Lord Jesus, thank you for your love and compassion. Help us to trust in you, especially in times of trouble. Give us the faith to reach out to you and the patience to wait for your help. Amen.***

**Being Gay & Catholic** – These should not be mutually exclusive terms. One should be able to be both Catholic and feel safe, loved, and accepted as a member of the LGBTQ+ minority group within the Church. However, that has not been the experience of many of our LGBTQ+ brothers and sisters. In 2021, Martin Scorsese released a movie entitled *Building a Bridge*, named after the book that Jesuit Fr. James Martin wrote to help the institutional Church be more accepting of the LGBTQ+ community. He asks both sides to reach out to each other with “*respect, compassion, and sensitivity.*” This worthwhile movie can be viewed on YouTube.

As we come to the end of Pride month, the Catholic Health Association of the US offers this prayer as a goal we can aim for: *Limitless Love.*

May we witness your extravagant artistry of each beloved, celebrate your Divine imprint upon each heart, and recognize how You fashion each human being with purpose and wonder. *Forgive us, Lord, for the constraint of our eyes that fails to take in another's beauty, for choosing the comfort of our own apathy instead of bearing one another's burdens, for not remaining silent to listen and silent when we should have cried out. Your limitless love forgives us all. We pray, O God, for the wounds the world inflicts in thought, word, and deed against what your hands have made and ultimately against You. Soothe and comfort, renew and redeem. Your limitless love restores us all.*
