Pastor's Column

Remembering and Honoring Our Veterans –

Some people get the 2 holidays that honors our veterans mixed up. So here's a refresher. Memorial Day honors our military men and women who have sacrificed their lives for our country on the battlefield. A tradition that accompanies this day is decorating the soldiers' graves with flags and flowers. The origin of this celebration goes back to the Civil War, to honor soldiers who have died for the Union and the Confederacy. Veterans' Day, on the other hand, honors all who have served in the U.S. Military regardless whether they're still on active duty or retired. The origin of this celebration, previously known as Armistice Day, goes back to the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month, in 1918, the day World War I ended. Archbishop Timothy Broglio, of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, said: *"In an age when the focus is always on the idol in the mirror, they raise their right hands to defend the Constitution, undergo training, keep watch, and risk everything for us... They risk their lives, sacrifice time with family and friends, set aside jobs, and often suffer the effects of their service into old age... They carry the reminders of their commitment and their past with them always... Today we pause to thank them, to say a prayer for them, and to recognize their commitment to our freedom... We ask the Lord to give them consolation and healing."* To our veterans and their families, who sacrificed alongside their loved ones, reading this column, please accept our gratitude for your generous service to us and to our country. May God richly bless you for your devotion to duty and to our country.
