Pastor's Column

Value of Fasting and Abstinence – In a column by Fr. Ronald Rolheiser entitled "On Fasting and Praying in Secret," he points out that philosopher, David Hume, questions the traditional virtues like celibacy, fasting, penance, self-denial, humility, silence and solitude. Hume would say that these virtues add nothing to society and even take away from human welfare. Those who practice these foolish virtues may, after their death, have a place in the calendar, but when alive, have no place in society because of their gloominess. So Fr. Rolheiser, while affirming the positive values of our virtues, does remind us that they are meant to help us enter into a deeper intimacy with God. He adds, "if our prayer and asceticism are healthy, what we should be radiating is precisely health, joy, love for this world, and a sense of how the ordinary pleasures of life are sacramental." He admits this isn't easy to do and suggests that this is the reason Jesus taught us to practice fasting and prayer not in public but in our "inner room." But he adds that in our world filled with addictions of all kinds: food, drink, sex, entertainment, social media and pornography, we need these traditional virtues all the more. In another article entitled "Value of Fasting and Feasting," Fr. Rolheiser shares that fasting is not about deprivation, but about creating space for something deeper, for an encounter with the Divine. When we fast, we can say "NO!" to our compulsions, and thus reclaim our freedom. We are no longer enslaved by our appetites but learn to live more intentionally, with God at the center. This act of self-denial allows us to empty ourselves of distractions, making room for God's grace to flow more freely in our lives. Fr. Henri Nouwen, in his column "Learning the Hidden Way," shares that fasting draw us in solidarity with the poor and hungry. It opens our eyes to the needs of others and challenges us to respond with generosity and compassion. So both authors help us see that Fasting is still relevant in our world and it can help us create space for our relationship with God, so we can experience His love and peace and radiate that back into our world. And it can help unite us to those in need, so that we can respond with a more generous and grateful heart.
