## Pastor's Column

Our Newly Baptized – Although we began in the Fall with 7 candidates interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, we ended with 3 who completed their Sacrament of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. They are Allan Sam, his son Jason Sam and Greg Trautman. Jason, in 6th grade, attends our elementary school and it was he who first expressed interest in becoming Catholic. His father, Allan, who had also attended a Catholic school in his youth, was not opposed to it and saw what it offered. He shared that he knows family in China and sees the difference in values his nephews and nieces have, versus he and his son who was raised with gospel values. So when his son wanted to become Catholic, he supported him and took lessons to become one as well. Greg, who also plays an instrument at the 10am choir, although baptized in the Presbyterian church, made a decision to join us and so was welcomed into the Church, and received First Holy Communion and Confirmation. We welcome them into our Church. In addition to these 3, 8 other adults from the Chinese community joined our Church and I look forward to sharing their story with you in the future.

First Holy Communion – This Sunday, we congratulate our students who have prepared for 2 years to receive Holy Communion with Christ. A man who had explored different religions, when asked what he thought of Christianity, the thing he found most amazing wasn't the miracles Jesus performed, or even that God became one of us, or that He rose from the dead, but that God wants to dwell with us. That helps us realize the gift that we may take for granted. God comes to us as simple bread, to be close to us because that's what lovers want to do; to be close to one another. We thank their parents and their teacher Ms. Talia Zerna for preparing them for this sacrament.
