- **Stability and hope:** In underserved areas, Catholic schools provide consistent education and a path out of poverty.

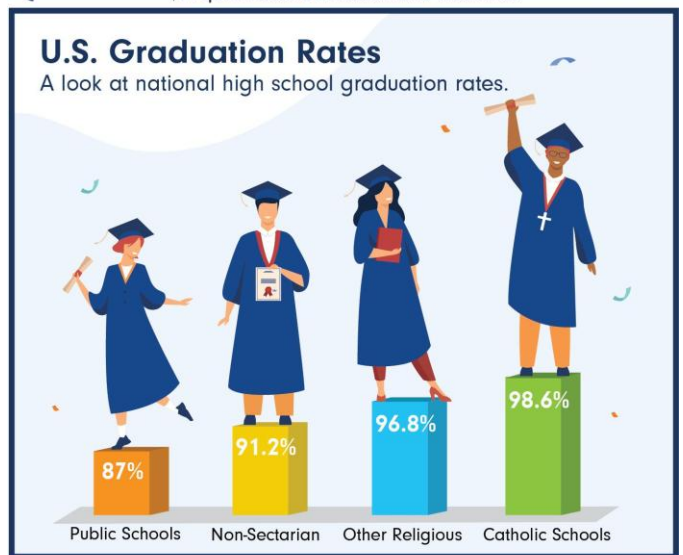
### For Our Nation

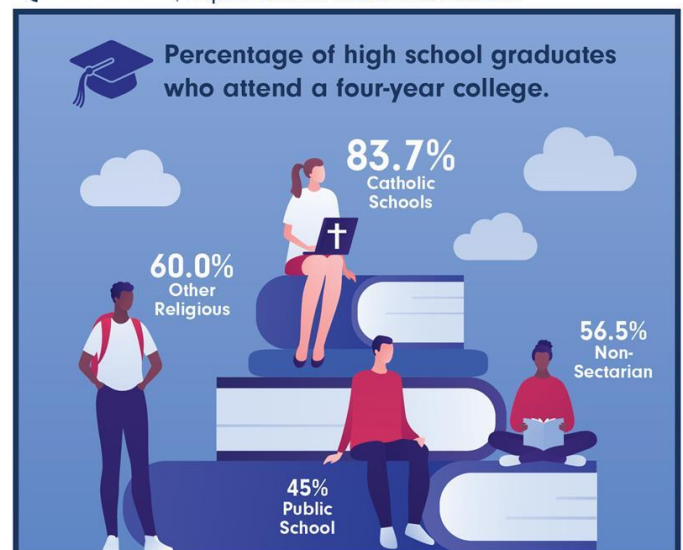
