



If you trust in God, you too shall live —Sirach 15:15b

CHOICE

"If you choose you can keep the commandments," Sirach tells us. God "has set before you fire and water; to whichever you choose, stretch forth your hand" (*Sirach 15:15, 16*). This is a great mystery: God does not control us so completely that we cannot choose our own path. We have certain boundaries, of course, but no one but we can choose our way within those boundaries.

In today's reading from Matthew's Gospel, Jesus reminds us of our freedom and our responsibility for our lives. He calls us to look beyond the words of the commandments, all the way to their meaning. Look beyond the adultery to the selfishness that poisons our love. Look beyond the murder to the anger that eats away at our compassion. Look beyond the perjured testimony to the lies and deception that drive our behavior.

FEAST OF FAITH— The Gloria (2)

The Gloria is a rejoicing prayer, an exclamation of praise. It begins with the song of the angels at the announcement of the birth of Jesus (*Luke 2:14*), a heavenly burst of praise for God's loving action in the world. But in the Gloria, the song goes on, leaping, as it were, from height to height, with every kind of praise, blessing, adoration, glory, and thanksgiving.

We begin by thanking and praising God the Father; then we turn our gaze to Christ, the Lamb of God. The paschal mystery of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection is found here, at the heart of this prayer, which descends to the depths with Christ, but then rises with him to the heavens, where he is seated at the Father's right hand. The Gloria ends with a series of acclamations to Christ, emphasizing over and over that he "alone" is the Holy One, the Lord, the Most High, truly God, with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Our prayer of praise ends where it began, in the "glory of God the Father." The Gloria, with its arc leading us from the glory of God to the suffering of Christ and again to glory, is the pattern of the Mass itself. At the center of all our prayer is the sacrificial love of Christ.


Pastor's Corner

Mental Health Ministry – In May 2018, the California Catholic Bishops' Conference issued a Pastoral Letter entitled "Hope and Healing" on caring for those who suffer from mental illness. The Archdiocese of San Francisco, in response to that letter, is partnering with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) to develop a pilot program in our Archdiocese. The purpose of the Mental Health Ministry would be to support those suffering from mental illness, their family and friends, as well as to educate the wider community to help end the stigma around mental illness. Historically, those who suffer from physical deformities, illnesses or diseases were shunned by the rest of society. So part of the goal of Mental Health Ministry is to help remove the stigma around mental illness so that they and their families don't have to suffer in silence and can find help and support from the community of faith. To be clear, this ministry is a ministry of accompaniment. It is meant to work in conjunction with medical professionals inasmuch as we human beings are made up not only of body and mind, but also spirit. So this ministry is an attempt to care for our souls, while the medical professionals help care for our minds and bodies. St. Anne volunteered to be part of this pilot Mental Health Ministry program. **Would you be interested to serve in this ministry?** You don't have to be a mental health professional, although those with experience would certainly be welcomed. Winter Cold and Flu Season – Because of the flu season and the corona virus outbreak, all parishioners are reminded to use common good sense. It is helpful to remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill, especially those who suffer from contagious disease. It is a sign of consideration for others that those with flu-like symptoms remain at home. For the convenience of those who are homebound or unable to attend Mass because of illness or infirmity, Mass is broadcast each Sunday morning at 6:00 AM on Channels 8, 20 (Comcast), and KTSF 26 as well as on EWTN. All ministers, including Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Musicians, Greeters, and Altar Servers, should also excuse themselves from serving at Mass if they feel any hint of a cold or flu. At Mass, we recommend using a wave or a bow for the sign of peace and also receiving communion on the hand.

Let us remember all those affected by the Corona virus and pray that researchers may find a cure for it and that it be contained; let us keep in our prayers all those who have died from it and those who mourn their passing, and lastly let us pray for the healing and recovery of all who are ill.


