Pastor's Corner



Back to School - On Wednesday, August 19, the students and parents were formally welcomed to school. There was a kick off ceremony beginning with the Kindergarten class at 9:30am in the school yard. After the welcome by our Principal, **Mr. Tom White**, the Kindergarten teacher, **Ms. Michelle Addae** led the students and families in prayer. As she is new to the school and to the San Francisco bay area, she introduced herself, welcomed the students and their families and invited them to pick up their books for the year. Families that needed a computer or tablet, could also borrow one from the school. After a few pictures, they departed in time for the 2nd group of students and parents to come in. This process was repeated every 30 minutes for each of the grades. Their teachers welcomed them, gave them some introductory comments and instructions, and the students proceeded to pick up their supplies for the virtual class at home. Prior to the opening day, the teachers and staff prepared all the materials for their students and placed them in a colorful bag along the bench in the school yard. It was good for the students to see their classmates and teachers, and for parents to see each other after such a long separation. I too was glad to see so many happy faces, even though everyone was behind a mask and to take pictures with them. The rest of the week the students began their classes at home. Fortunately they were only half days to help transition from Summer break back into the classroom. And even Kindergarten students seem comfortable with their electronic devices, knowing when and how to mute themselves, raise their hands and when to unmute to speak. I want to thank Mr. White, all the teachers and staff for so quickly adapting to the changing environment. They had to plan for in person classroom attendance as well as the virtual classroom and a mix of both. As the number of covid-19 cases decreases in the City and we are allowed to return back to the classroom hopefully by September 8, San Francisco Health Ordinance still only allows for 12 students per classroom. During the Summer, a team of parents helped wire our classrooms so that as one teacher teaches in one classroom, the rest of his/her class can simultaneously watch from another classroom. With a teacher's aide in the other classroom, this electronic connection also allows for the teacher to see his/her students in the other classroom should they raise their hands for questions or if they are misbehaving. So to **Mr. Wai Wong**, **Mrs. Min Min Sun**, **Mr. John Liwanag**, **Mr. Stuart Goldkrantz**, **Mr. Mike Limpahan**, and **Mr. Victor Gonzalez** we owe a debt of gratitude for the technology and interface with the teachers, the wiring from school building to the Kindergarten building, and the wiring just for the Kindergarten building. **Wai, Min Min, John, Stuart**, and **Mike** spent three days with setting up cameras and connections, first to establish what was needed, then another day with the teachers, then the third day on our first day of school monitoring that all was working smoothly. Currently, except for preschool, all instructions are done virtually. The teachers teach from their classrooms, but the students are at home. As the number of infections in the City decreases, hopefully someday soon they'll all be able to return safely to the classroom. Thank you teachers and parents for continuing to make St. Anne School great even during the Pandemic.
